

Icebreaker: Give Encouragement and Appreciation



- 1. Divide the children into two groups.
- 2. Each group will take turns and say something that can encourage their friends like "You're awesome!" "Be Strong!" or "You can do it!"
- 3. Write their encouragements on a board like steps.
- 4. When either team runs out of things to say, you can connect the steps and draw a person on the top.
- 5. Remind the children to always be encouraging to each

other because God always encourages us!

Introduction:

God loves you and wants to encourage you today. Did you know that God has special plans for your life? Did you know that he thinks about you all the time? Did you know that he goes with you wherever you go? He does! When we encourage people, we give them courage, hope, or confidence. Today, we will learn about a man named Joshua who really needed encouragement from God. Let's find out how God encouraged Joshua!

Bible Story:

After Moses died, God told Moses' helper, a young man named Joshua, that he was to be the new leader. Imagine taking the place of someone like Moses—Moses, who led the Israelites out of Egypt, through the Red Sea, and across the desert! Imagine if you suddenly had to be pastor of a big church. How would you feel? Would you be in fear and full of worries? How do you think Joshua felt? Joshua probably felt scared because the job was so big. He probably wondered how he could ever lead the Israelites as well as Moses did.

Even though Joshua might have been scared about taking Moses' place, God wanted him to be strong and full of courage. (Print Joshua 1:7-9 and read to children → see below) God said to Joshua, "Be strong and very courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go. Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:7-9) With God's encouragement, Joshua became a great leader for Israel!

God has a purpose for each of us, just as he had a purpose for Joshua. And you don't

have to wait until you're grown up. God has things for you to do right now—loving others, doing well in school, and obeying your parents. Sometimes it's very hard to love others or obey our parents or do our homework every day. God wants to help you and encourage you when those things seem too hard to do. God is on our side to guide and encourage us today the way he did for Joshua long ago.

Questions to discuss:


- 1. Who was the first leader of Israel who died? (Moses)
- 2. Who did God choose to be the second leader of Israel? (Joshua)
- 3. Did Joshua think being a leader of Israel was an easy thing to do? (No.)
- 4. What should you do when your friends or family members are having a hard time in life? (Encourage them like how God encourages us)

1. Print the foldable book template (see below) as well as the verses.




- 2. Help children to fold and cut the book template so that they can fold it into a book. Use the instruction from the diagram here.
