Song: Select songs from the list above.

Icebreaker: "Holy Ground"

Materials Needed: Khroma

1. Divide the children in 2 groups and have them stand in 2 lines.
2. Open and place the khroma in the middle of the classroom. Explain to the children that the khroma represents a holy place of God.



3. When the game starts, each child will run to the end of the classroom and return. But when they get to the khroma, they need to kneel in front of it (don't touch the khroma because it is holy) and pray (say "Thank you, God") and then continue to run. If they touch the khroma, they lose the game.

4. The first group to finish the race wins the game.

5. After the game, explain to the children that when things are holy, we treat it differently. Today, we will learn about God who is holy.

Introduction:

God is higher than us because he is holy; God is perfect. Holiness has several different meanings, and today we will explore what we mean when we say that God is holy.

Bible Story:

Today's Bible story is about God calling Isaiah to work for him as a prophet for Judah. When God called Isaiah, God gave Isaiah a vision of himself. Isaiah saw the Lord high and lifted up. He wore a royal robe that was so long that it filled the whole temple!

In this temple, Isaiah also saw special angels called seraphs. These seraphs had six wings! Two wings covered their faces, two covered their feet, and two wings were used for flying. Isaiah smelled smoke in the temple, too. And Isaiah heard the seraphs calling, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty!" Isaiah said that the seraphs' voices were like thunder! They were so loud that the doors shook.

When Isaiah saw God in the temple, he knew just how special and holy God is! He also saw how different from God he is. He knew he had done sinful things that made God unhappy. One of the seraphs flew to a table in the temple and used tongs to take a hot coal and touch Isaiah's mouth with it to make it clean!

Then the Lord asked, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" Isaiah said, "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah wanted to help this great and holy God.

Holy means set apart for special treatment or use. We approach a holy God differently than we approach a friend. God is set apart, special, different from even the most respected human being. God is holy because he is perfect and free from sin and perfectly good. Yet, this holy God loves us and wants to be our very best friend, and he invites us to come to him and love him all the time!

God also asks us to be holy. When God asks us to be holy, it means to be different from the ways of the world and be special like the people for the Kingdom of God. Our holy God wants to make us holy, so he works in our lives to change the things that aren't pleasing to him. God helps us to become holy because he is holy. And we have a great privilege to volunteer to serve God just as Isaiah did. Let's be holy because God is holy and say to God, "Here I am, Lord, send me."

Questions to discuss:

1. What did the angels in the temple of God say? ("Holy, holy, holy is the Lord!")
2. What does it mean to be holy? (different from the world, perfect, pure and sinless)
3. How can we be holy? (be different from the world, be special like the people for the Kingdom of God, change the things that aren't pleasing to God)
4. Why should we be holy? (Because God is holy)

Game: "Clapping Hands"

1. Have the children stand in one group.
2. When the teacher has their arms straight out, the children do not need to clap.
3. When the teacher moves one arm higher than the other, then the children have to clap.



4. If the children don't follow the teacher's motion for 3 times, they need to sit down and be out of the game.

5. Play the game until there is one winner.
6. After the game, explain to the children that they needed to pay attention to the teacher in order to play the game. In the same way, we always need to pay attention to God in order to be holy.

Memory Verse:

For it is written: "Be holy, because I am holy."(1 Peter 1:16)

Craft: "Send Me"

Materials Needed: Print craft sheet, crayons

1. Print craft sheet for each child.
2. Let them draw their hand on the sheet and color everything.
3. Teacher should ask, "Who will go to help God? Who can God send?" Have the children say, "Here I am, Lord, send me."
